
## **Making a Grid**


## Always use a ruler!!!

**Step 1**: Measure the length and width Of your picture.



Step 2: Draw a box around your picture. The box should be drawn to the nearest whole cm larger than your picture.


i.e. - 8.5 would round up to 9 cm.



**Step 3**: Measure out your grid lines. Gridlines must be evenly spaced and must be the same for the vertical and horizontal axis. It is always best to use whole numbers (i.e. - 1 cm, 1 inch)




## **Step 4**: Label your grid use letters and numbers



**Step 5**: Now that your first grid is set up it is time to start your transfer grid. Get a new piece of paper large enough to fit your enlarged image.


**Step 6**: How large do you want your new image? If you want it twice as large then double your measurements, three times as large then triple them.

**Step 7**: Draw a new box on the blank sheet of paper. In this example we will triple the size of our picture so our box will be 12cm X 27cm. (3X4=12; 3X9=27)




## Always use pencil!!!

**Step 8**: Draw on your grid. Remember to change your grid size to match your new dimensions. We tripled our size so our grid spacing is now 3 cm. (1X3=3)



Step 9: Label your grid.



**Step 10**: Transfer your image, grid by grid.

**Step 11**: Erase your gridlines and color your picture!
